That is the mission behind the Eclipse RxTM device.

The Eclipse Rx™ device is water resistant with a sleek high tech unisex design. The device tracks and logs how many steps you take daily and pairs/syncs with its own innovative mobile app. It has multiple sensors that gives you an estimated UV Index (strength of the sun) and calculates how much time you can be outside before you start to receive skin damage.

Q. Coconut Water: Can We Get to the Heart of the Matter?

A. Coconut water is the latest trend in packaged water. It is over a \$1 billion industry. But, can coconut water be dangerous? The answer is maybe. One ingredient that is not well marketed in coconut water is potassium. Potassium, when elevated, can be quite dangerous. The most common side effect of an elevated potassium is an irregular heartbeat. Most people's kidneys can manage potassium without any problems. However, a large number of people who drink coconut water may be at risk if they are also takina an acne medication.

The average age of a person drinking coconut water is between 25 and 29 with 80% being females. An acne medication that is used very frequently in

these women is called *Spironolactone*. It is a hormonal acne medicine that works by blocking testosterone along the jawline and chin. This medicine is designed to help women with those breakouts especially in combination with oral birth control.

The reason this medicine can be danaerous to women in conjunction with coconut water is that it can diminish the release of potassium by the kidneys. While this is not bad with the normal consumption of potassium, if a person is drinking a significant amount of coconut water, they may hold in an excess amount of potassium thus creating a dangerous situation for the patient. So, the bottom line is tell your doctor about anything you do in excess so that we can give you better skin for a better life.®

Q. Olive Oil & Sunflower Oil: Delicious and Dangerous?

A. While people often use olive oil and sunflower on their skin for moisture, it may not be such a great idea for infants. The Internet has made these oils seem like a great help to everyone's skin. However, eczema is becoming a worse problem. The rate of childhood eczema has increased from 5% to 30% since 1940.

A study performed in the United Kingdom chose three groups of newborns to evaluate. The newborns are separated into three groups. One group received sunflower oil, another group received olive oil while the third group used none. At

the end of the 4 weeks. the researchers examined the lipid lamellae structure (literally fatty plates or flakes) of the skin of the babies in all three groups. The lipid lamellae are in the stratum corneum—the outermost laver of the skin—and play an important role in the vital barrier function of the skin. The findings suggest that using olive oil and/or sunflower oil early in life may delay the natural development of lipid lamellae in the skin barrier which may lead to a problem and add to the risk of eczema.
